A WORD FROM YOUR STUDENT PASTOR

We kicked off Lent on Ash Wednesday with a meditation on the Book of Daniel. In Chapter 1, Daniel and his friends have been selected by the Babylonian King, Nebuchadnezzar, to be his special servants in the royal palace. As part of their training, they are to eat the king's food and drink the king's wine every day. But Daniel, a faithful Israelite, did not want to defile himself by eating the king's food because it was against the Torah custom of the Israelite people. So, he convinced the chief official to give him and his companions nothing but vegetables to eat and water to drink. Ten days later, Daniel and his friends looked stronger and healthier than all the rest of the servants who had eaten the king's food! They were given spiritual gifts of knowledge, prophecy and vision and they became sought after members of the king's court.

Daniels obedience to his tradition of not eating certain kinds of meat wasn't just blind obedience to a religious law. It had a powerful effect of helping him to keep his strength in God in a very complicated situation. Daniel's people, the Israelites, were oppressed by the Babylonians. To be selected for service in the royal palace among the powerful elite who were holding his people in captivity - now that was a dangerous tightrope to walk! On the one hand, Daniel could be lured into giving up his loyalty to his people for the newfound status and privileges he would receive. On the other, he could possibly influence the King to look favorably upon the Israelites, becoming their advocate in the halls of power.

One way to interpret Daniel's "fast" is that Daniel needed to keep himself clear about who he really served - not the King, but God. His fast allowed him to grow spiritually and to maintain a clear head so that he could become a powerful advocate for justice without getting distracted by the King's shenanigans.

As we journey through Lent, Daniel's fast can help us to deepen our discipleship. Lent is a time where we take up specific practices to help us go deeper in our relationship with God. And Daniel helps us to see that these practices can help us grow prayerfully in our ability to be a voice for God's justice in the world. This Lent, what is the king's food in your life, and how might you fast from it? What are the distractions that keep you from living your soul's purpose? What practice(s) can you commit to, to deepen your discipleship this Lent? Here are some ideas if you're having a hard time coming up with one:

- Fast from technology, social media, negative talk, or inflammatory news
- Fast from meat (Did you know that eating less meat is the single biggest way to reduce your impact on the environment? Check out more information here: https://www.theguardian.com/environment/2018/may/31/avoiding-meat-and-dairy-is-single-biggest-way-to-reduce-your-impact-on-earth)
- Set aside time each day to pray (even if it's just two minutes!)
- Pick a book in the Bible that you have never read and read a little bit every day
- Find images of God that don't look like you (i.e. another gender, race, or ethnicity) and put them up around your home
- Learn about a social cause that you care about and find a way to take action
- Create a sacred space in your home dedicated to prayer like a prayer closet or an altar
- Spend time each day journaling about where you saw/felt God's presence in the day

Our Wednesday night Lenten series this year is called "Deepening in Discipleship." We'll be looking at hard issues and "touchy topics" as we try to understand more deeply some of the injustices that are embedded in the roots of our society and what God has to say about them. And we'll be growing spiritually as we practice the sacred art of journaling. Come out and join us at 7 pm on Wednesdays this Lent!

Can you help us to ensure accuracy? Here's the thing during the past few weeks, the financial group has received donation envelopes with only an envelope number or a first name. Both of these situations pose a real problem. The way our current donation system works we do not use envelope numbers as identification. This is an issue for cash contributions. You see, with no name, there is no assurance that a cash contribution can be credited correctly. When you write checks, fortunately, they provide a name so your offering can be credited properly.

Please remember that donation envelopes with only a first name pose the problem that we may have four Michaels or three Bettys. In my example you can see that several people can share the same first name. So ... the problem arises – which one of several possible donors am I to credit? To ensure you receive proper credit for your contributions, please use both first and last names on your envelopes or write checks. Additionally, we do not record the envelope numbers any longer because of the system we use. Thank you for your help so we can ensure our accuracy!
